It is with great pleasure that I provide this letter of recommendation for Kerrie Parsons, RN. I came to know Ms. Parsons in January 2020 when I assumed the position of Department Chair with responsibility for hiring clinical teaching faculty for sophomore, junior and senior level clinical experiences. Ms. Parsons was an established semester by semester contract employee at that time with a history of dependability, clinical acumen, clinical teaching skills, and student satisfaction.

Ms. Parsons continued to provide clinical instruction in the acute care setting through Spring 2023. I noted that she enthusiastically and skillfully supported students in successfully developing foundational skills, clinical judgement, and patient management competencies.
